Philippian Jailor	"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Ac 16:30)	"Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house." (Ac 16:31)	UNBELIEVER The jailor had not yet believed the message of the gospel. The first step in obeying the gospel is to believe.  The gospel was preached to the jailor and he obeyed it (Ac 16:32-33).
Jews on Pentecost	" Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (Ac 2:37)	"Repent, and be baptized for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."  (Ac 2:38)	BELIEVER The Jews heard Peter's sermon (Acts 2) and believed.  Having already believed, they were commanded to repent and be baptized.
Saul (Paul)	"Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" (Ac 9:6) "What shall I do, Lord?" (Ac 22:10)	"arise, and <u>be</u> <u>baptized</u> , and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord." (Ac 22:16)	PENITENT BELIEVER  Paul already believed and repented. He spoke to the Lord on the Damascus road and expressed a penitent attitude. He prayed to God and fasted (Ac 9:9,11).  The only thing Paul lacked was being baptized.

These people were at different starting points when told what they needed to do to be saved.
