
Israel's First King

King Solomon and the Temple





Rehoboam wanted to go to war to force the 10 tribes to accept him as king but God told him not to. Israel was now divided into two kingdoms: Israel to the North and Judah to the South.








Jonah - God's Reluctant Prophet




Rebuilding God's Temple

Ezra 1 (NIV)

The Babylonians, who had taken the Israelites captive, were now defeated by the Persians and a new Persian King named Cyrus ruled over the Israelites. In the first year of his reign he made an important proclamation that made the Jewish people very happy. Cyrus told the Israelites that they could go back to Jerusalem to live and rebuild the temple to the LORD.
