In the religious world there are many manmade philosophies, ideals, practices and doctrines. The word "doctrine" basically means "a belief that is taught." According to the Bible there is only one true doctrine (the gospel of Christ, and it is of divine origin – <u>Gal. 1:6-12</u>); all else is man-made and is therefore false doctrine.
